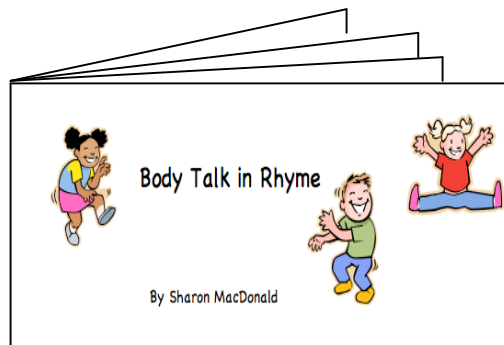


Lift the Flap Books

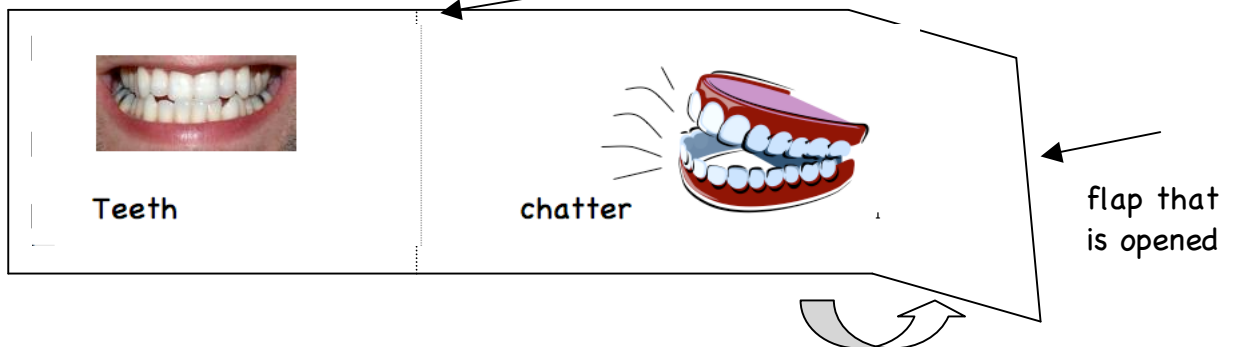
Here is a *Lift the Flap Books*. The children **lift the flap out** to finish the storyline. Children find it exciting to get the "answer" by lifting up a flap.

Cut the pages apart and fold the flap to the dotted line. Put the book together and staple or use 2 notebook rings. As the children "read" the book they guess what the answer is and then lift the flap out to check their answer.

I do this in small group. After we have "read" the book, I send home a copy and the directions to the parents.



The flap is folded to the dotted line.
